Reordering Photostream

Your photostream always shows your most recently uploaded photos first. If you want to change the order, you can edit the posting dates for photos.

Edit dates

- On the photo page, click More (three horizontal dots).
- Click Edit title, tags, and dates.

Another easy way to order your photos is to create and edit a set.

Create a set


- 1. Move your cursor over the You tab.
- Select Sets.
- Click + Add New Set.


Rearrange photos in a set

- Move your cursor over the You tab.
- Select Sets.
- Select the set you want to modify.
- 4. Click the Edit tab.
- Click Arrange.
- Select from the options in the pull-down menu.
- 7. Click Yes.

This is "Batch Organize" As it says below, you can click, hold and drag the images at the bottom into the editing space, here. Once you have a group of images selected, you can perform the same action on them all, as in the small print under "Batch".

Drag items here to edit them as a batch. You can then change any attributes or create a new set.



"NaNoDrawMo is a personal challenge to push would-be artists beyond the bounds of comfortable "when I have time" practice for one month and see what happens.


Loosely defined goals are for each participant to produce 50 individual works/drawings between Nov 1 and Nov 30."
